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NASA takes tech proposals from 11 Colorado small businesses

NASA has chosen research and technology proposals from 11 Colorado small businesses for negotiation of possible development contracts. Nationwide, 300 proposals with a combined value of about \$38 million were selected. The NASA program helps businesses explore technological potential while providing the incentive to profit from new commercial products and services.

The partnerships bring space technologies to the marketplace while helping startups, creating jobs and meeting NASA's current and future mission needs, said Michael Gazarik, NASA's director of space technology.
